### Description

Teamwork is a valuable skill for the family, for the workplace and for the community. To develop team skills, learners need to practice making decisions relating to one another's styles in a learning atmosphere that allows trials and opportunities to lead and to follow. Scans skills (Labor Secretaries Commission for Achieving Necessary Skills) identifies several skills needed: allocating time, allocating money, allocating materials, allocating resources, working on teams, leading, organizing/maintaining information, thinking creatively and developing individual responsibility. Working on simulated teamwork assignments can be a motivating way to learn and practice teamwork skills.
